#Save Our Pharmacies Campaign: Request for action from your Chair.



- We are encouraging you, your colleagues, friends and family to get fully behind the #Save Our Pharmacies national campaign. We want to see thousands of citizens, patients and pharmacy staff in Somerset, get this petition promoted and signed! The public #SaveOurPharmacies petition reached 33,200 signatories on 22nd March. This is a good start, but we need to continue to build the numbers significantly to show the strength of support for our cause.
- Unity is strength and when speaking as a single and loud voice, people have the power to
 make the politicians think and do differently. Please can we ask that you ask your

Professional development and wellbeing

1. New clinical skills training offer for community pharmacists launched [Action]



- Health Education England is making available 10,000 module places for clinical skills training for community pharmacists to be delivered by <u>CliniSkills</u> between 17 April 2023 and March 2024.
- This will give community pharmacists the opportunity to build on their existing clinical examination and consultation skills to assess, treat and manage common health problems.
- Following completion of a required, online gateway module on history taking and identification of serious conditions, you can choose your preferred journey through four optional modules, based on professional interests. These modules cover four key themes: dermatology, cardiology, paediatrics, and ear, nose and throat.
- The content will be delivered online using a flexible and responsive eLearning system, with optional face-to-face attendance.
- This offer is available to community pharmacists, including part time staff and locums working in community pharmacy.

2. Emergency contraception, safeguarding & child exploitation online training [Book now]

 This training is required for community pharmacists to deliver Emergency contraceptive (EC) services in Somerset under the Somerset County Council PGDs.



- It is for pharmacists new to providing this service or those due for refresher training (minimum every 4 years). Access the PGDs and supporting resources at the LPC website.
- This programme includes:
 - Levonelle and Ulipristal acetate PGDs.
 - Sexual health.
 - Safeguarding and child exploitation.
 - Local referral pathways.
- Next training date (7:00-9:30pm online) to be decided once enough people have joined the waiting list.

1. Prescription charge rises to £9.65 from 1st April 2023 [Action]



- The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has increased the NHS prescription charge to £9.65 per prescription item from 1st April 2023.
- Please continue to help patients to save money by signposting them to the <u>NHS Pre-payment</u>
 Certificate.
- PSNC is in the process of updating its charge card and PPC poster. These will be available on their website in due course. Read more here.

2. HRT pre-payment certificate guidance published [Information]

- To reduce prescription costs for women receiving Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT), on 1
 April the Government is launching the <u>HRT Pre-Payment Certificate (HRT-PPC)</u>.
- To enable this, from 1 April prescribers will need to issue prescriptions for HRT items (which are listed in the Drug Tariff as being HRT licensed for the treatment of menopause) as single-item prescriptions (i.e., separate from other prescription items). Further guidance for prescribers on the HRT PPC will be published in due course.
- The NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) has published <u>HRT PPC guidance.</u>
- PSNC will shortly publish a briefing containing supplementary information and a comprehensive set of FAQs to support contractors and their teams.

Operations

1. Whole-pack dispensing of sodium valproate to be made mandatory [Action]



whole-pack dispensing of medicines containing sodium valproate; rounding up or down to the nearest quantity prescribed, will apply as soon as the amendment to the Human Medicines Regulations (HMR) 2012 comes "into force".



- The move will prevent the drug being dispensed in unlabelled white boxes, without the statutory patient information leaflet (PIL) and associated warnings, helping to address concerns that some women remain unaware of the significant risks posed to their unborn baby should they fall pregnant while taking sodium valproate.
- Pharmacists will be able to make an exception to whole-pack dispensing of medicines containing sodium valproate on an individual patient basis, where a risk assessment is in place that refers to the need for different packaging, such as a monitored dosage system.
- Consultation on flexibility to dispense up to 10% more or less of other medicines continues. The government has asked the administrations in England, Northern Ireland and Wales to decide how they want these to apply (implementation in Scotland is immediate).

2. MHRA Class 2 medicines recall: Pholcodine containing products [Action]



- A reminder that the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) has issued a class 2 medicines recall for all pholodine containing products (from various marketing authorisation holders).
- Following the conclusion of a review of post-marketing safety data by the MHRA, all pholcodine
 containing medicines are being recalled and withdrawn from the UK as a precaution. <u>Find out</u>

- New <u>resources to support general practice</u> are now available from DHSC.
- The digital materials were tested by practices who found them a useful resource when making referrals.

5th April 2023	Deadline to have claimed payment for the provision of at least 20 NMS since
	1st April 2022 (the Advanced services gateway criterion).

1. NHSE Terms of Service End of Year Requirements [Action]



- As part of the Terms of Service all community pharmacies are required to confirm they have completed the following requirements of the Terms of Service for this year 2022/23:
- The following annual declarations are required:

- Pharmacy Patient Leaflet Available Deadline 31st March 2023
- Valproate audit. Deadline 31st March 2023 see below.
- In House Clinical Audit Your own Company (in house) clinical audit has been carried out. Deadline 31st March 2023.
- Annual Complaints Review for period 1st April 2022 31st March 2023. Deadline 30th April 2023.
- A self-declaration form is available on PharmOutcomes for all community pharmacies to complete.

- 2. URGENT: Submit your national valproate audit 2022/23 data by 31st March 2023 [Action]



- By 31st March 2023, you must have completed the 2022/23 national clinical audit on valproate over a six-week consecutive period, and have submitted the data via the Valproate audit 2022/23 tab on the Manage Your Service (MYS) portal.
