NHS Somerset issued the following NHS Pharmacy First news release on 30 January 2024:



NHS Somerset launches Pharmacy First for the treatment of seven common conditions without needing a GP appointment – 31 January 2024.



From 31 January, residents who are registered with a Somerset GP, can pop down to their local pharmacy for help with seven minor conditions which would previously have required a GP appointment. At the pharmacy patients will be able to have a private consultation about their condition, be offered clinical advice and if needed, will be offered NHS medicines.

(NHS prescription charge apply if you normally pay for medicines supplied on prescription).

The conditions are

- Sinusitis (children over 12 years and adults)
- Sore throat (children over 5 years and adults)
- Earache (children 1 to 17 years)
- Infected insect bites (children over 1 and adults)
- Impetigo (children over 1 and adults)
- Shingles (over 18's)
- Urinary Tract Infections (UTIs), (women 16 65 years).

As experts in medicines and managing minor illnesses, community pharmacists have the skills and knowledge to be able to offer advice and help.

Should the pharmacy team be unable to help, you will be directed to your GP surgery or A&E as appropriate.





Michael Lennox CEO of Community Pharmacy Somerset (LPC) says, "By thinking 'Pharmacy First', people in Somerset will find it easier and quicker to get the help they need for seven common minor conditions and bypass the 8am rush to book an appointment with their GP".

The new service will give people more choice in where and how they access care. Pharmacy First, will save up to 10 million GP appointments over the next year, helping people to get the care they need more quickly. In Somerset, the scheme is likely to free up thousands of GP appointments every year, for patients who need to see their GP.

Training for NHS Pharmacy First

Face to face training: All the training sessions currently planned are now full.

Pharmacy technicians

Upskill your pharmacy technicians to fully engage in service delivery and clinical assessment skills to support new services being offered through community pharmacy by encouraging them to complete the CPPE Community pharmacy technician: advancing your role programme.

The whole pharmacy team

Brief your teams-they may come across patients who are eligible for the service who they can encourage to engage. Emphasise that walk in patients are allowed to access the service as well as referrals.

PharmOutcomes

PharmOutcomes has also produced some great resources including **general information**, a video and FAQs which can be found on the home screen before you log into PharmOutcomes.

Promote the service

- 1. Communicate regularly with your team; hold daily huddles to discuss the service, who is eligible and any opportunities missed.
- 2. Brief your surgeries that you are ready to start the service and communicate what can the surgery teams do to assist you.
- 3. Access and use the **CPE and NHS resources to promote the service**:

Claim for the service

- 1. All claims for NHS Pharmacy First must be submitted via your MYS portal monthly.
- Remember the threshold to maximise the payments your pharmacy can receive by doing the
 minimum amount of NHS Pharmacy First provisions as set out at the <u>CPE Pharmacy First</u>
 webpage.
- 3. Your pharmacy needs to complete one national clinical pathway; one from UTI, Impetigo, sore throat, infected insect bite, shingles, otitis media (if your pharmacy is eligible to provide this pathway) and acute sinusitis, in February 2024 and five in March 2024 in order to claim £1000/month. If you do not achieve five clinical pathway consultations by the end of March 2024, the initial £2000 fixed payment which was paid when your pharmacy signed up to the service will be reclaimed.
